

We had the good fortune to have 6-11 dedicated volunteers and 2-4 trucks with trailers to move 21 loads of road mitigation slash to the slash pile for us. (Thank you, Ed, for letting us in to use the slash pile. We appreciate it!)

We managed to accumulate 236.25 volunteer hours which translates into a savings of \$6.851.25 for our GVM HOA.

The North 40 Food Pantry is run by the North 40 Mountain Alliance, the Red Feather Lakes Library and over 50 volunteers. The pantry started due to the strain of COVID. With inflation, the residual effects from COVID, and now increased property taxes, the financial strain on families keeps growing. We may not be able to help with inflation, but we can make sure that you and your loved ones can eat. We see and hear about the struggles and stress our community copes with every day and we are honored to hear their stories and offer a helping hand.

We have distributed over 800,000 lbs of food. We have served over 66,670 meals. We are now serving 80 - 130 families a week. We are open every Friday at Chapel in the Pines from 9:30-11:30 am. Evacuation: How and When to Get Out – Don't hesitate because you don't know what to do. 
MESSAGE FROM THE GVFPD BOARD PRESIDENT
